Easter 2008

Beloved in Christ Jesus our Risen Lord and Saviour,

Do you have a favourite Easter hymn? Is it one with lots of hallelujahs? Hallelujah means "Praise the Lord!" This is indeed the time to praise the Lord because Jesus is risen ... he is risen indeed! We celebrate Christ's victory over sin, death and the devil. We rejoice in the gifts that His victory gives: forgiveness, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting.

Here's a challenge for you. Can you sum up the whole Easter message in just one word? The hymn, "He's Risen, He's Risen" does it, at least its original German it does. The original uses the word "Erstanden." That's rather neat, especially since the original in Greek also uses just one word for the angel's message, "he is risen."

I love this hymn because it paints such a wonderful picture. Verse 4 tells us that death has now lost its sting, paradise and heaven are now ours, sin is paid for by his blood on the cross, we are redeemed and forgiven, we are his, now and forever.

My favourite verse, though, is the second one. It gives us the beautiful picture of Good Friday night:

*The foe was triumphant when on Calvary  
The Lord of creation was nailed to the tree  
In Satan's domain his hosts shouted and jeered,  
For Jesus was slain, whom the evil ones feared!*

Close your eyes and imagine the celebration in Satan's sanctum. That must have been some party! Down through the centuries, God and Satan had struggled head to head, nose to nose, one on one. The struggle had gone on skirmish after skirmish, with God preserving the promise of a Saviour, the seed of the woman to one day crush Satan, and the devil trying to short circuit the promise.

God gave Adam and Eve two sons - the beginning of the promise's fulfillment. Then the Devil tempts one to murder the other. He thought that would be the end of the promise! But God sent another son to carry on the promise. So it went, generation after generation. God promised to deliver Israel from slavery. Satan tried to drown Moses in the Nile River. It didn't work. Time and again Satan tried to short circuit the promise and plan for a Saviour. Time and again the Lord sidestepped the move and continued toward the goal.

Finally, after all that time, everything came down to Calvary. It all came down to Jesus. This one would be for all the marbles. It's the seventh game of the cup final, the score is tied. It's overtime and there's no tomorrow. Everything is riding on the Son of God. The hopes and fears of all the years are met in him.



Late that Friday afternoon, Jesus cried out in a loud voice and gave up his spirit. The earth shook, the curtain in the temple was torn in two. The women wept; the disciples were scattered; the cold stone sealed the tomb. The devils were overjoyed and the fans went crazy! What a party Satan and all his demons were going to have. The King of kings was in the grave; death held the Son of God in its grasp; corruption was about to do its work. So the devil leaves death and corruption in charge while he and all the rest of the demons spend a night on the town. It's time for a party and they have a devilishly delightful celebration dinner, devilled eggs, devilled ham sandwiches, barbecued wings with hot sauce and lots of extra Tabasco, jalapeño peppers on the side. For dessert it's devil's food cake.

That's why I so delight to sing the third verse of that hymn. Its theme is a simple one: "Surprise Satan, you lose!"

*But short was their triumph, the Saviour arose  
And death, hell, and Satan he vanquished his foes  
The conquering Lord lifts his banner on high  
He lives, yes, he lives, and will nevermore die!*

Death was supposed to hold Jesus. Corruption was supposed to get rid of him. But neither one could touch him or hold him. The devil thought that Jesus' death would end the struggle and give him the victory. Was he ever wrong.

St. Paul says it this way, "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Do you know what that victory means? It gives us a hope and a future. It gives us reason to celebrate and sing.

Peter would later write these words: "And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." What do you believe? Because Jesus is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity ... what follows?

What follows is that God has blessed you with every spiritual blessing as you celebrate Christ's victory over sin, death and the devil. It follows that you and I can rejoice in the gifts that His victory gives: forgiveness, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. It follows that you and I have the privilege of sharing this glorious message.

Yes, the victory is won, but the struggle continues. We struggle daily to overcome sin and temptation, and when we fail, Jesus come near, calls us by name and forgives us anew. Then he gives us a new struggle - he invites us to be part of the struggle for souls, lost souls, souls that don't know that sin has been paid for, souls that don't know this Saviour, souls that need to hear the message, he is risen. He is risen indeed!

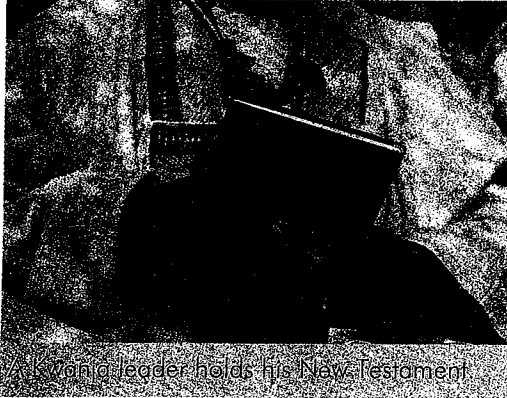

*A woman leader holds his New Testament*

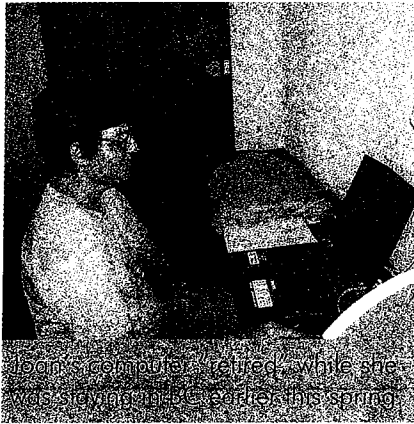
Just fanciful, historic stories? Hardly! There were too many first-hand accounts from those wanting to share them so others would know. Meant to be treasured by not only the eyewitnesses, for us in the 21st century "who have not seen and yet have believed", Jesus blesses us with them too *(John 20:29b)*.

How do miracles connect with the efforts of Lutheran Bible Translators of Canada? Ask any of our translators because they see the connection almost every day. When Jesus Christ is revealed to His people who have never heard of him, it is an amazing experience. Watching the miracle of them hold a New Testament in their mother tongue language for the first time makes every effort worth it.

All involved at Lutheran Bible Translators of Canada, including you and me, depend on the miracle of God providing these skilled translators to tell others about Him and putting Scripture into their hands. As prayer and financial partners, we are the vital link to sending and supporting workers. Through us, the miracle of "resources" assists translators and literacy experts continue to do this holy work effectively.

Martin & Joan Weber, LBTC missionaries to the Kwanja people of Cameroon, plan to return to Africa in June 2008 after their seven-month furlough in

North America to continue literacy work. Their airfare is \$2500. While this is a very good price for such a trip, it is still a very big expense for Lutheran Bible Translators of Canada.

When they return, the Webers will need two new computers and other equipment to continue their work. Weather conditions, technological changes and almost-continual usage wreak havoc on their computers in Africa. Yet this equipment is essential for communicating and designing literacy material so the Kwanjas will learn their language and understand their New Testaments. Through the financial assistance of friends at Saviour Lutheran Church in Delta BC and matching funds from Faith Life Financial, Martin's computer has already been purchased. We still need \$1300 to cover the cost of Joan's computer, the war-

ranty, extra RAM memory, DVD burner and 6 flash drives.

Regarding other equipment that would be useful, Martin didn't take long to suggest "more tape players". Apparently when their son Sammy and his teammates were in Cameroon on a summer work term in 2004, they recorded Old Testament story tapes. While some old tape players/recorders are still being used, they really need ten (10) additional players so more Kwanjas can hear these recordings. Martin advised that he can get batteries and solar panels for free from a group in Michigan. All he needs is the tape players and estimates \$650 will cover this cost.

**From the Principal's Desk  
Greetings from Lois Munz

Friday, March 28, 2008**

Many important calendar dates happened within a short time during this month. The children were only at school thirteen days in March, as March Break and Easter were only a few days apart this year. As well, it was difficult for the teachers to try to use the theme that "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb", with snow and cold temperatures persisting throughout the month.

However, the Biblical messages of Passion Week and the celebration of our Lord Jesus Christ's glorious resurrection, as the reason for Easter, were taught and reinforced through stories, poems, songs, art work and role playing. The children have the assurance that "because He lives, we will live also – eternally". What a wonderful message to be able to share!

The children enjoyed sharing the Easter message – and juice and cookies – with the "grandmas and grandpas" at Erin Mills Lodge. It truly is special when some of the residents are reminded of songs from their pasts and join in to help the children sing some of them. It is very helpful to have Pastor Flohr provide the guitar accompaniment to keep us in tune with the melody.



The signs of Spring in nature are becoming more evident, so the students are watching and reporting on what is being observed. We are waiting patiently for the first robin to appear in the neighbourhood.

Preparations have been made for the Open House dates of March 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 2008. It is encouraging to have new families tour the facilities and take information packages. We pray that they will choose to have their children enroll in our programs.

The special Sunday Open House was planned to have a convenient time for congregational families to meet with school Staff and gain information about the benefits of choosing a Christian school setting for their children. The Staff was invited to attend the 11:00 a.m. worship service and be introduced to the congregation before the luncheon/Open House.

Christ Our King Nursery School/Kindergarten would like to thank the members of the congregation who took part in the Holy Week Prayer Vigil, for including prayers for our Staff and students. *And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints. Ephesians 6:18*

A School Parent/Guardian Service Satisfaction Survey was distributed to each school family. Seventeen surveys out of a possible thirty were filled in and returned. The topics on the survey covered facilities, staffing, educational services, religious programs, family events, future plans and advertising.

There was a high degree of satisfaction (level 5, with a few at level 4) reported on each of the topics. Word of mouth was foremost on how people knew about the school, with the signage out front being a close second.

There was the most interest in enrolling children in the Junior Kindergarten for next year, as well as interest in the school offering an afternoon Nursery School program.

- You know the children as individuals and enjoy them, challenge them to learn and encourage them to grow at their own pace
- You provide a safe, fun educational environment for young learners
- One on one interaction with children
- Questions and concerns dealt with sensitively and efficiently
- Make learning fun
- The family Advent stuff was very impressive!
- Take good care of the kids, show interest in our family
- Involvement with the Lodge (grandmas and grandpas), music, good crafts/art
- One of my favourite things is seeing the teachers face to face daily.
- Greet and form relationships with families; we are not just a number
- You are open – public schools (for what they feel are safety issues) remain “hidden”
- Your encouragement to families in their walk with God is greatly appreciated
- You respect kids and are very kind to them.
- You made my child like school
- Some Staff are excellent, others need some time for me to acquaint with before I place a judgment
- Keep up the great work – more Summer events to keep the school connected
- Working with my financial situation (thanks!)
- Choosing a good teacher for my daughter whom she really likes because of the amount of fun and learning she does
- Excellent job keeping the driveway ice-free
- Very clean classroom
- Staff very friendly and professional
- I am pleased with my child’s learning in Nursery School. Great resources!
- Very professional and nurturing atmosphere
- COK is a terrific place
- Everything!
- We love the school and its programming
- The school makes it seem like a very Christian, very family friendly school

What could we do better?

- A little more academic focus (i.e. printing letters earlier in the year)
- Show work samples at parent interview time
- Could the program be lengthened (9 – noon)?
- The playground/play structure could be up-dated
- Snow not removed sufficiently from parking lot and play area
- Do the children have opportunities to acquire computer skills?
- I am not familiar with the computer facilities

- More updates on how the kids (NS) are adjusting at school, perhaps an additional parent-teacher meeting between January and March
- More children in the Kindergarten

The school families are invited to join the congregational Family Night on Wednesday, April 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. for a meal and age appropriate activities.

A "Kids Concert" is being planned for Saturday, April 26, 2008, from 1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. An invitation will be going out to our Nursery School/Kindergarten families as well as congregational families and families in the community. The performers for the concert will be the members of "The Crew" who will be at Christ Our King Church for the weekend doing a workshop with the youth and taking part in the worship service. Please plan to join us.

## From the Library Shelf

### Focusing on Prayer

Consider how your own prayer life might be deepened and how the scope of things you pray about might expand.

1 Thessalonians 5:16 & 17, "Be joyful always, pray continually, giving thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." James tells us it is His righteousness and not any of our own which gives us access to God and opens up the very heart of prayer and praise. Humility, patience, perseverance, wisdom, justice, peace and love shape the integrity of our lives, which in turn deepens our commitment to prayer.

Pray for the grace to praise even when it doesn't come willingly. "Have mercy on me, Lord!" Matthew 15: 22. Read the article on page 34 in Good News – Encouragement, Issue 30.

"Establish my footsteps in thy word and do not let any iniquity have dominion over me," Psalm 119:133. Read the article on page 35, Good News – The Power of Sin, Issue 29.

From Writings from the Wilderness – Lenten Reflections 2008: When most people think of prayer, they're thinking of asking God to do something and expecting Him to answer. While I won't deny this aspect of prayer, when Jesus walked the earth and taught His disciples to pray He had a different emphasis in mind. His focus wasn't on us asking God to do something. His prayer, the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:1-4), is an encouragement for us to trust God as He's revealed himself and to ask for His desire to be realized in our lives and in the world around us. In this sense, prayer serves as something to refocus my thinking so my thoughts are God's thoughts, and I'm holding on to the promises He's made to me. "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10.

Those who spent one hour with Him on Good Friday or Holy Saturday at church going through the booklet "My God, My God, Why have You Forsaken Me" – the Lord's Prayer and the Lord's Passion, will now be familiar with the ACTS concept. Too Busy Not to Pray – Slowing Down to Be with God, by Bill Hybels elaborates more on this and other ways to help us focus on the Lord.

E. M. Bounds devoted most of his writings to prayer. Andrew Murray – The Prayer Life – a humble and honest look at prayer by a humble saint.

Marjorie Holmes – I've Got to Talk to Somebody, God: – a woman's conversations with God. Just short "arrow" conversations that cheer the heart.

May the Lord richly bless us as we learn to pray without doubting (Matthew 21:22) and expect great answers from our great God. (Ephesians 3:20).

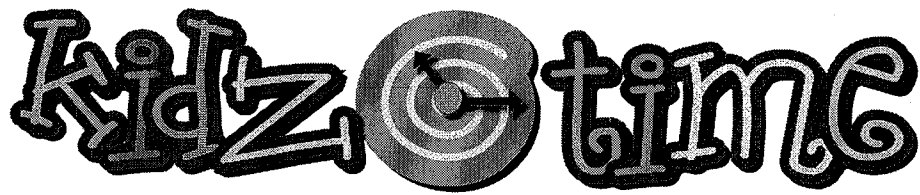

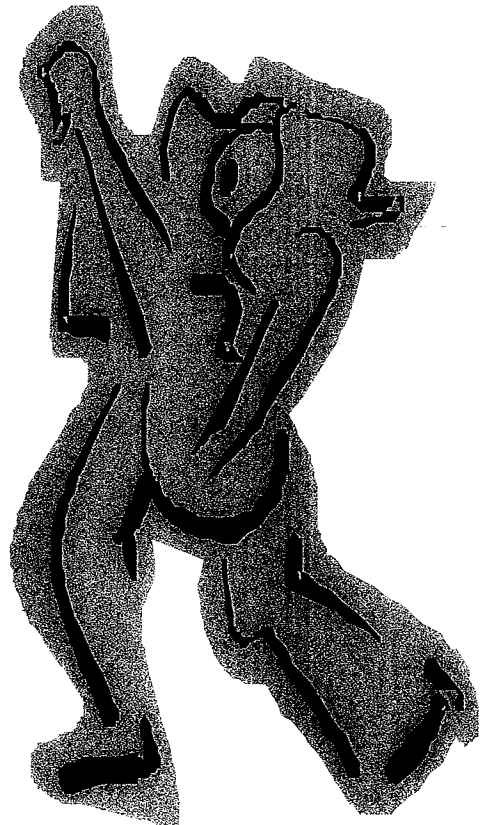
