


Attention All Choir Members (and any newbies who'd like to join us)

Rev. Basil Christi, our Associate Pastor-Elect



The Reverend Basil Christi (Vasilios Christoforidis) was a former spiritual skeptic who converted to Christianity twenty years ago and embraced Lutheranism, in particular, fourteen years ago. Prior to following the Holy Spirit's prompting to prepare for the pastoral ministry, Pastor Christi served as the Director of Christian Outreach (DCO) at The Church of Saint Mark-Lutheran, in Mississauga, for five years.

In 2009, he began his studies at Concordia Lutheran Theological Seminary, in St. Catharines, and, while pursuing a Masters of Divinity degree through Brock University, was admitted into the pastoral program in the following year. He served his vicarage at Redeemer Lutheran Church, in Waterloo, Ontario, under the supervision of the Reverend Robert Krestick.

On May 31st, 2014, he received his first Call to minister to the congregations of Peace Lutheran Church, in Taber, Alberta, and Duchess Lutheran Church, in Duchess, Alberta, and was installed as their pastor on September 7th, 2014. Pastor Christi received the Call to serve the congregation of Christ Our King Lutheran Church in mid-June of this year and will be installed as Associate Pastor on September 18th.

Over the course of his spiritual journey, his time as DCO, his vicarage, and his years serving in Alberta, Pastor Christi has been afforded numerous opportunities to connect the Christian community to the greater community-at-large for the sake of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ, God's Word to the world He so loves, and it is his most heartfelt desire that such moments will continue to multiply as he now prepares to enjoin the congregation of Christ Our King Lutheran Church in ministering to those whom God has set in their midst, in the City of Mississauga. Pastor Christi's faith journey has taken him full circle in the course of his life: "I was brought up, nominally, Greek Orthodox. My family and I were in church, at most, twice a year— the last ones in, first ones out! As a child, I simply didn't get to hear the Gospel. It was only later in life, when my wife, at that time my fiancé, became a Christian, that I started to consider the claims of Christianity as I set out to discredit her newly formed faith because it had started to adversely affect my hedonism, that is, the pursuit of pleasure that defined my life up to

that point in time. In the course of doing so, I used my background in history to follow the evidence for the resurrection of Christ, thinking that it would simply lead to a particular path, a spiritual dead-end, and certainly not down the road which I now travel... let's just say that the stone that was rolled away at Easter rolled right over me and my arguments!"

Pastor Christi and his wife, Rebecca, have been married for nineteen years and have two children: a ten-year-old daughter, Evangelica (Angel), and a six-year-old son, Alexander.



Beloved in Christ Jesus,

As Marjorie and I work through the process of moving from one home another this month, I am enjoying the refreshing feeling of offloading 20 years of accumulated "stuff" from the garage ... and the basement ... and the closet ... and ...

Maybe you know what that's like. Or maybe you don't. If you've lived in the same house for 20 or 30 or 40 years, or more, the off-fall of life kind of accumulates around you. It creeps up ever so slowly until you find yourself in over your head and don't know how you got there.

I don't think I'm a hoarder, but there were boxes and bins of nuts and bolts, nails and pieces of wire, odds and ends that I have dragged around from place to place *since 1976*. As I looked over the accumulated pile on the workbench I made two resolves to myself:

- I am not going to pack and move this stuff again ...so it went to the garbage, or Value Village ...
- I am not going to let this happen again ... the basement at the new place is empty and unfinished, and it is going to stay that way. I am not putting anything down the basement.

I have this new sense of freedom, as if a great burden has been lifted from my back. There is a wonderful sense of relief to be found as you move from one place to another. Think of yourself as a root-bound plant that has outgrown its pot. Re-pot it with fresh dirt and it takes on a reborn feeling, a new life.

It's as if life, or more correctly God, has given you a doover. The game of golf even has a term for this. A mulligan is a second chance to perform an action, usually after the first chance went wrong through bad luck or a blunder. In the game of golf, a player is informally allowed to replay a stroke, even though this is against the formal rules of the game. You whiff your tee shot and the ball lands four feet away. Or your second shot makes a splash in the lake. Sometimes it not your fault, like when your almost perfect birdie putt gets redirected by a chipmunk.



This morning what I want to talk how we serve a God who is the God of the do over. He is the God of the fresh start ... and His church is "A Place of New Beginnings."

As God's dearly beloved children in Christ, we are a people who get do overs and fresh starts with God... AND we all, need a new beginning every now and then? That's what our life in Christ is all about.

Our sins, whether big or small, can accumulate over time, and we often try to deal with them by simply ignoring them, or perhaps feebly promising to deal with them ... sometime ...

Or ... maybe God would just give us a do-over. Just pretend that shot into the rough, or the sand trap, or the lake, didn't actually happen. Just erase it.

Dear friends, life doesn't come with an undo button. To simply erase sin would not take into account the holiness of God, nor the stain of sin and the wickedness of our hearts.



All that junk in the garage, that pile of uselessness on the workbench, it all had to go somewhere. There were only two choices: find someone to take it off my hands and get rid of it, or keep dragging it around for the rest of my life (and then it would become someone else's problem).

Our gracious God does not simply ignore our sin, He promises to do something with it. He sends His Son to be "the Lamb of God who carries away the sin of the world." The pages of His book are full of people finding fresh starts and new beginnings in the Lord and at the cross. Think about Joseph, Zacchaeus, the woman at the well, Samson, Mary Magdalene.... True stories written down for you & me so we will never forget that our God is the God of forgiveness.

The answer to a wayward tee shot is a mulligan. The answer to the problem of sin is the cross.

LOOKING FORWARD..... August 2016 Update

As we get closer to September, things are getting very busy as we prepare for the arrival of our Associate Pastor, Rev. Basil Christi, and his family. What an exciting time at COK!

Since our last update, Pastor Flohr and Marjorie have found rental accommodations that will allow them to move in August, which means that we have a few weeks to prepare the parsonage before the Christis arrival on the Labour Day weekend! They are happy with their accommodations, and are also contributing to the rental cost of the home since it is a nice home and it was a good situation for their family.

Now that we have more information concerning our associate pastor, and the housing needs have been sorted out, we have been able to revisit and assess our projections for the remainder of 2016 and 2017. Overall, we are projecting to underspend by approximately \$5,000 in 2016 and overspend by approximately \$5,000 in 2017, so altogether, we are on par with last year's projections! This is quite a blessing, given that the housing costs were considerably higher than we anticipated, and that we inadvertently did not budget for some allowances for the associate pastor. However, other items were over-estimated for 2017 which has helped to balance our projected costs.

Of course, this still represents a significant challenge to our congregation on a financial level, and also in terms of doing things that we haven't done before (or for a long time!) and in managing changes in our congregation.

The congregation has already begun to get involved in helping to prepare the rental home for the Flohrs to move into, and preparations are under way to transform the nursery room beside the cloak room into Pastor Christi's office.

As we continue our preparations, we would ask that you consider ways in which you can help out:

- Work days will be scheduled in order that many hands can help make the work light! We will also be scheduling work for clean-up of the parsonage, both inside and out in late August. Please see your emails for future information and consider helping out.
- Much of the congregation's costs of moving our pastors (half is covered by our participation in the District's Moving Fund) and setting up the second office will be paid for from our Second Pastor Fund. The current balance in this fund is now over \$40,000, with our goal being \$80,000. This fund will also help ensure adequate coverage of future salaries in times of budget fluctuations. We ask you to prayerfully consider what you are able to give to the Second Pastor Fund by marking your contribution as "2nd Pastor Fund" on your offering envelope.
- Please continue to pray for our pastors and their families during this time of transition, and for the safe arrival of the Christi's.

Bible Class Bits and Bites

The Nature of True Saving Faith

Scripture is clear that the one thing a person must do to be saved is have a 'true saving faith' in Jesus the Christ. Faith is the instrument that God uses to bring individuals into a saving relationship with Himself. This does not mean that faith is the basis of our salvation; instead it is the channel by which God grants salvation. The saving power of faith is not in itself, but in Jesus on whom our faith rests. It is not, strictly speaking, even faith in Christ that saves, but that Christ saves through faith.

Faith comes to the believer as a gift from God. It is not something that we are able to create or choose on our own. If faith is a work of our own doing, then we would be in a position to take partial credit for our redemption. But such a concept is foreign to Scripture. Paul, being led by the Holy Spirit, anticipated that people would want to boast of contributing to their salvation when he wrote "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast", (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Faith comes as a result of the regenerating work of the Holy Spirit; He quickens our hearts to believe. Apart from the new birth, there can be no true faith. Therefore, faith, though it manifests itself in action, comes as a result of God's work in us. God grants us faith and that faith is evidenced by walking in good works. "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them", (Ephesians 2:10).

The Bible says that if we believe on the Lord Jesus Christ we shall be saved. However, the Bible does not present faith as simply knowledge about Jesus or even mental assent or agreement to the facts of the Gospel. True saving faith involves repentance from one's sin and a complete trust in the work of Christ to save us from sin and make us righteous. The Reformers spoke of three aspects of faith: 1) knowledge (recognition) of the truth of the Gospel; 2) assent (agreement) with the Gospel truths and their exact correspondence to our spiritual need; and 3) trust (action) that results in a personal commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ who, by virtue of His death, provides the only sufficient sacrifice for our sin. Any one of these three aspects of faith, taken by themselves, is insufficient to meet the Biblical definition of saving faith. However, the presence of all three components together results in saving faith. In other words, saving faith consists of knowledge, assent and trust which results in living a more Christ-like life. Saving faith involves the mind, the will, and the body.

In addition to calling us to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, the New Testament uses several figures of speech to describe the nature of saving faith. Perhaps the most vivid of those figurative references is found in Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied", (Matthew 5:6). In that passage, Jesus likens true faith to hunger and thirst. The unbeliever, by virtue of the regenerating work of the Holy Spirit, recognizes their dire need of spiritual nourishment and refreshment and comes to Jesus the Christ trusting that He will fill their need. That is a beautiful picture of faith. First, there is recognition of Jesus' claim to be the "bread of life", (John 6:35) and the possessor of "living water", (John 4:10). Next, the unbeliever is convinced that Jesus' promise is really true and that it corresponds exactly with his profound spiritual hunger and thirst. Finally, the unbeliever acts; he asks Jesus to satisfy his hunger and quench his thirst. True faith hears, believes, and actively responds to the Gospel message.
