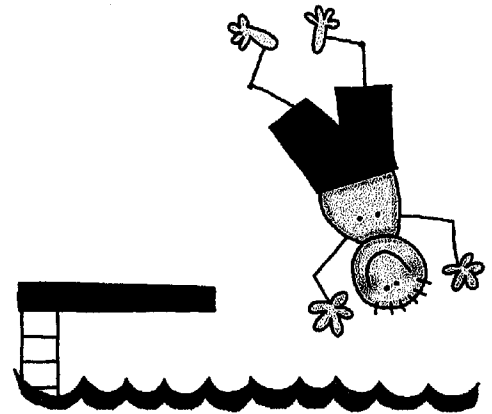

In Deuteronomy 4, God calls on his people to take his Word to heart. Words like “Follow it” ... “Do not add to it” ... “Do not subtract from it” ... “Keep it” ... “Observe it” ... “Do not forget.”

Why should we take God’s Word to heart? Two reasons:

1. First of all, your blessed life this side of heaven depends on it. By “blessed life” I don’t mean you will necessarily be rich and famous. A blessed Christian life is a life lived in connection and communion with Christ. As redeemed children of God, we have peace with God through Christ. We can be content in any and every circumstance and situation. It does not mean that we will have a life free from sickness or trial or trouble. It does mean that our gracious Father in heaven is with us in the midst of them, and that he will, in his time, deliver us from them.
2. Secondly, your blessed life in eternity depends on it. In John 6 as many of Jesus’ followers were beginning to desert him, he asked the 12, “Will you also leave?” Peter looked Jesus in the eye and said, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life!” Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven, given among men, whereby we must be saved.

Yet how often we consider God’s Word of little value and importance. We neglect worship, often without realizing that we are hurting ourselves most of all because we are starving our faith, which needs to feed on the Word. We consider Bible Study of little value ... a waste of time ... and do not grow beyond a Sunday School level of understanding. Personal and family devotions are often hit and miss, with more miss than hit.

Deuteronomy 4:9 takes the commands concerning God’s Word a step farther. There God says of his Words and Laws, “Teach them to your children and to their children after them.”

It’s not enough to only be concerned about your own spiritual life. God calls us to help one another, and he calls parents and grandparents ... and every adult Christian ... to teach God’s Word to the next generation.



Think about all the things you teach your children ... all the things that you were taught by your parents. There’s the usual stuff of walking, talking, toilet training, eating with something besides your fingers, drinking from a real cup. You try to teach them manners and politeness. You want to give them a sense of self-esteem and confidence. As they grow you begin to pass on to them the passions and interests in your own life ... love of nature and the outdoors, soccer, golf, swimming. You teach them life lessons in finance and romance, cooking and carpentry. All the things that are important to you get passed on to them.

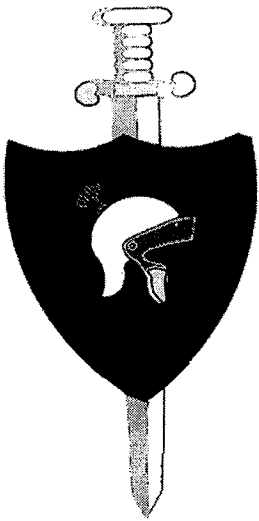
One of the saddest things I see as a pastor is when parents neglect to pass on spiritual things.

A son stood up to talk at his father’s funeral service. He wanted to share with everyone who had come what a great dad he had and how much he would miss him. He and his dad had spent lots of time together ... at the rink ... on the golf course ... traveling ... hanging out. Weekends were great. His was the best dad ever!

It made me think of my own dad. My dad worked evenings, from 4:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m., so he and I didn't have all those times together. My dad was sick and in the hospital when I learned to drive, so he didn't teach me. We never golfed together. I can count on one hand how many hockey games we went to together. But what he did do was of utmost importance ... he got our family to church. He got my sisters and I to Sunday School. He instilled in us a love for God and for God's house. He did the one thing most needful ... he connected us to Jesus.

That's the challenge I want to put in front of each of you today. Don't neglect the spiritual life of your children. Don't consider of little value the spiritual lives of the children and youth of our congregation and of our Nursery School and Kindergarten. Can you think of any work in which God is more pleased, than to teach these young ones about Jesus and his love?

I have a challenge for you today. Whether you are a parent or not, here it is. We call it:



A Prayer Partner Challenge:

Did you know that this school year we have 21 or more college and university students from our congregation who are facing the challenges of life in a setting that can often put a strain on their faith and Christian life?

Did you know that this school year we have 20 or more of our youth going to high school? They too face the challenges of peer pressure and the struggle to perform academically. Their life is more and more out in the world, and they also face the struggle of living a Christian life.

Did you know that we have 36 Sunday School aged children in our congregation? God calls parents to be the primary spiritual teachers for these little ones, and he calls the church to partner with parents to help and encourage them in this work.

Did you know that 12 of those Sunday School aged children from our congregation *rarely, if ever*, come to Sunday School.

Did you know that we have five little ones on our cradle roll, who have become children of God, heirs of heaven and members of COK through the sacrament of Holy Baptism? When they were baptized, our congregation agreed to help and support them and their parents.

Did you know that our Nursery School and Kindergarten enrollment currently stands at about 25 children?

On Sunday, September 13th we will launch a **Prayer Partner Challenge** to our congregation.

We will be asking everyone or at least every family to "adopt" one of our Nursery School or Kindergarten children, or one of our cradle roll or Sunday School children, or one of our high school youth or one of our University or College students.

The challenge is simple ... pray for them ... encourage them ... send them a little note from time to time to let them know that you are keeping them in your prayers.

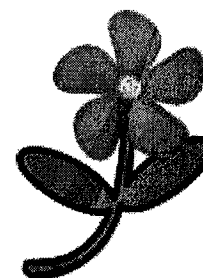



Financial Reports

July 31, 2009

The financial statements included in this report consist of the following:

1. Consolidated Statement of Financial Activities, and Changes in Congregational Resources.
2. The Balance Sheet.
3. The Income Statement which includes a comparison to the annual budget.
4. The Designated Funds Statement.

Highlights are as follows:

- Total assets of the church equal \$1,560,164, of which \$31,967 are cash and cash equivalent assets. This represents a drop in assets of \$15,558 from December 31, 2008, when it was \$1,575,722. This reduction is mainly reflected in a drop of \$13,330 in the current balance in our bank account.
 - Increases to the Designated Funds totalled \$12,394, of which \$6,200 was from donations, with \$488 coming from Euchre Nights in February and May, \$3,818 was from transfers and corrections, and \$2,377 was from the PST refund. Decreases to the Designated Funds totalled \$7,626, of which disbursements to designated projects totalled \$3,809, and \$3,818 were transfers and corrections.
 - Total revenue of \$124,668 from the regular weekly offerings is \$2,914 over budget, and is \$5,431 greater than last year's offerings of \$119,531 at this time. This represents some improvement over the June 30th's offerings of \$111,368 which reflected an over-budget amount of \$975, but the year over year comparison of \$5,431 is significantly greater than the June 30th's year over year comparison of \$2,992.
 - Expenses incurred by the various boards total \$145,473 and are \$2,096 under the 2009 year-to-date budget. Total expenses at this time last year were \$148,636, which is \$3,162 greater than this year's expenses.
 - We are currently operating at a deficit of \$20,511, compared to a budgeted deficit of \$22,385, and a prior year deficit of \$29,105 at July 31, 2008. With regard to the budget, we are \$5,303 better than the projected deficit, and we are \$8,593 better than last year at this time.
- * The results for June 2009, as highlighted above, shows that the challenges in our financial position continue as shown in the depletion of our cash resources, and we will continue to have these challenges as the year progresses. Our bank balance is being depleted in order to meet the shortfall between our revenues and our expenses. We thank you for your prayer support in asking God to enable us to meet these financial challenges as we move into the latter part of the year. We also ask you to pray for God's guidance in your own individual stewardship roles in helping the church to overcome these challenges as the year progresses. Please remember that it is important that you keep up with your offering commitments to our church during the summer months as the salaries and bills we need to pay still continue during these months. If you have missed attending services during the summer months, please consider giving a catch-up offering this fall to enable us to meet our financial obligations.

Speak an Encouraging Word

When people ask us to lend them our ears,
sometimes we offer instead a piece of our mind.

If a person tells you in confidence something stupid he has done,
be slow to criticize.

Don't say, "Whatever made you do such a thing?" or

He needs someone to hear the confession.

Do them a favor by listening for a while, and

then change the subject.

Say, "When I have troubles, I find it helpful to
stress the positive.

The Bible tells us, 'Give thanks in all circumstances.'

(1 Thessalonians 5:18) There must be some things for which you
can be thankful. Name a few and concentrate on them."

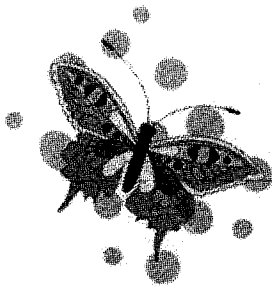
As opportunity arises, speak a word of encouragement.

Tell how God has answered your prayers.

Explain how your faith helped you through crises.

Witness to your confidence in God's love,

"What He has done for others, He will do for you."

should not hinder us from pleasing Him.





